LABOUR MARKETS AND LABOUR POLICIES

Labour markets have witnessed a transformation from the manufacturing economy of the past to the service economy of the present. The most significant of the large-scale changes have been the global shift of manufacturing employment and the growth of service employment. With the transformation of labour markets, labour policies have also changed. What types of changes (gender, age, generations, future) relate to present labour markets? To what extent can labour policies meet nation-states' needs in global transformations?
